Food Service

Food would be delivered directly to your group.

Trading Post

While your son or daughter is at camp, they'll have an opportunity to check out the camp store, also known as the Trading Post. There's plenty of healthy snacks, candy, trinkets, wilderness tools, clothing, and slushies to go around. If you've never tried a slushie, this is your opportunity! Items range from \$.50-\$30 depending on what you are purchasing. There are some clothing items for adults that tend to run a little more expensive depending on size.

Camp Lingo

There are a few terms that are familiar to camp and we want to make sure you are in-the-know before coming to camp. Buddy/Truddy is used to describe groups of 2 or 3 that we encourage youth to move through camp in.
